

Discipline of Family Medicine Emergency Medicine Program



Emergency Medicine is a fully accredited one-year program designed to provide physicians with the complex skill set necessary to practice Emergency Medicine.

Eligibility - Prospective applicants must be:

- currently enrolled in an accredited Family Medicine Residency Training Program in Canada; OR
- in practice (CCFP certified or eligible to sit the CCFP examination)

All successful applicants must be eligible for registration on the Educational Register of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Newfoundland and Labrador.

Program Objectives

The Emergency Medicine Program at Memorial University is designed to:

- provide a formal teaching setting to prepare trainees to successfully sit the CCFP examination in Emergency Medicine;
- train physicians to the high level of competence and confidence necessary regardless of where they practice;
- provide a broadly developed skill set to enable the physician to be a teacher and teach in the rural or urban Emergency Department; and
- enable the emergency physician to take a leading role in the administration of emergency services in the community.

Training Sites

All core Emergency Medicine rotations will be completed in St. John's, with the exception of Orthopedics (Gander or Corner Brook, NL), Anesthesia (Grand Falls, NL) and Pediatric Emergency (Ontario).

Curriculum

20 weeks	Adult Emergency Medicine (includes EMS)
4 weeks	Pediatric Emergency
4 weeks	Anesthesia
4 weeks	Coronary Care
8 weeks	Intensive Care
4 weeks	Orthopedics
4 weeks	Plastics
4 weeks	Elective
