Family Medicine Residency Program

This two-year program has been approved and accredited by The College of Family Physicians of Canada. It provides eligibility for residents to sit the certification exam in Family Medicine.

Experience the lifestyle of Newfoundland and Labrador. Our program has been developed using the unique medical and geographic characteristics of the province to train physicians for rural and remote practice. Our specialized generalist colleagues teach our residents in regional and community centres across the island, in Labrador and in New Brunswick. Our second-year sixteen-week rural family medicine rotation is particularly valuable in gaining experience in rural or semi-rural practice settings.

Opportunities are available for interprovincial and international electives. We also offer a pre-clerkship shadowing experience at urban and rural sites.

Applicants should be aware that in this program residents pursue their educational objectives at teaching sites distant from the medical school. All educational sites outside of St. John's have accommodations. Most accommodations are provided free of charge. Certain sites are more appropriate for families. Many sites require the residents to have their own transportation available.

There are 20 regular residency positions available in each year of our program.

In developing educational objectives, we have used the four principles of The College of Family Physicians of Canada:

- The Family Physician is an effective clinician.
- Family Medicine is community based.
- The Family Physician is a resource to a defined practice population.
- The Doctor-Patient Relationship is central to the role of the Family Physician.
