Biographical sketch:

Edward Smith Peters "E.S. Peters" (1909-1990), Chief Diagnostician and physician, was born in St. John's, Newfoundland and Labrador on March 26, 1909 to Joseph Peters and Fanny Elizabeth Smith. He was the youngest son. E.S. Peters married Ruth Katharine Story (1914-2000) in 1939. Edward and Ruth had three children: Helen Ruth Katharine "Helen R.K." (March 19, 1942-), Edward Bruce (February 10, 1945-) and Janet Isabel Story Steer (September 22, 1952 – December 3, 2013). His daughter Helen is a retired English professor at Memorial University as well as a published author. His daughter, Janet was the Director of Nursing at the General Hospital in St. John's and she played an integral role in the establishment of the former Lillian Stevenson Nursing Archives/Museum.

Peters received his early education at the Methodist College in St. John's, NL. He attended Memorial University College in St. John's before moving to Montreal, Quebec to study medicine at McGill Medical School. He graduated from the McGill Medical School on March 10, 1933. Dr. Peters then interned for two years at the Ste. Agathe Sanatorium in Quebec, focusing on tuberculosis. Upon graduating, in 1933, he accepted a job as Medical Director on the S.S. Kyle. He then returned to Montreal in the fall of 1933.

Dr. Peters returned to his native St. John's in 1935, working as Assistant Superintendent of the St. John's Sanatorium. He remained in this role until 1938 when the Avalon Health Unit was formed and established in Harbour Grace, NL. Dr. James McGrath was Director of the Avalon Health Unit and Dr. E.S. Peters was Chief Diagnostician. In 1942, Dr. Peters became Director of the Avalon Health Unit after Dr. McGrath was appointed Deputy Minister of Health. Dr. Peters accepted the Directorship of the new Tuberculosis Dispensary in 1947, in St. John's. The Avalon Health Unit in Harbour Grace was dissolved upon this move to the St. John's dispensary.

In 1948, Dr. Peters received a Fellowship from the Rockefeller Foundation. He pursued postgraduate studies at the University of Toronto until 1949. Dr. Peters was appointed Medical Superintendent of the new West Coast Sanatorium in Corner Brook, NL, in 1950. Dr. Peters supervised the construction of this new health facility. Dr. Peters then spent some time on the M.V. Christmas Seal, a boat traveling around Newfoundland and Labrador providing care for tuberculosis.

Dr. Peters learned of a new treatment to prevent tuberculosis (TB) from Dr. Armande Frappier of Montreal, Quebec. Dr. Peters started using this treatment, which came to be known as the BCG Vaccine (Bacillus Calmette-Guerin). Since prevention and drugs to prevent tuberculosis were

being used and discovered, the Sanatorium outlived its purpose and closed down as a TB hospital in 1964.

Following the closure of the Sanatorium, Dr. Peters became a member of the Board of Directors of the Provincial Tuberculosis Association. He held the position of Director of Tuberculosis Control in Newfoundland and Labrador until his retirement in 1974. He was also the President of the Newfoundland Thoracic Society from 1966 to 1968. Dr. Peters also acted as the Director of the St. John's General Hospital and on the board of the Janeway Children's Hospital upon its opening in St. John's.

Dr. E.S. Peters was awarded an honorary membership in the Canadian Lung Association in 1981. He passed away on October 9, 1990. He is remembered for his knowledge of and treatment of tuberculosis patients across Newfoundland and Labrador. He played a vital role in implementing successful procedures to treat and prevent TB.

Custodial history:

The records of Dr. E.S. Peters were held in the custody of his daughter, Helen R.K. Peters until being donated to the Faculty of Medicine Founders' Archive in 2015.

Scope and content:

Fonds consist of one folder containing 21 photographs and textual material relating to Dr. E.S. Peters' medical career.

Source of title:

Acquisition:

The records of Dr. E.S. Peters were acquired from his daughter, Helen R.K. Peters in 2015.
